

IMPORT



European context

- Goal: high level of food safety, animal health and plant health
- Legislation based on the 'three sisters':
 - Codex alimentarius
 - OIE
 - IPPC
- Internationalisation: higer risk for the spread of animal diseases and plant pests



European context

- Food legislation, including General Food (and Feed) Law (GFL), Regulations 852/2004 and 853/2004
- Animal Health Law (AHL) Regulation (EU) 2016/429
- Plant Health Law (PHL) Regulation (EU)
 2016/2031
- New Official Control Regulation (OCR) Regulation (EU) 2017/625



European context : OCR

- verify compliance with food and feed law, animal health and welfare, plant health and animal-by products rules.
- more harmonised and coherent approach to official controls and relevant enforcement actions along the entire agri-food chain.
- minimise the burden on businesses.




European context : OCR

- take into account the likelihood of fraudulent and deceptive behaviours
- enhance transparency of official controls (ex.
 Publication outcome and enforcement measures)
- Provisions for border controls (import) and official certification (export)
- Gradually implemented from 14th of December 2019 on

- EC Competence (DG SANTE)
- Provisions in the OCR:
 - integrated approach to import controls
 - more emphasis on risk-based approach
 - Border Control Posts (BCPs) with minimum requirements for facilities, equipment and staff qualifications
 - All consignments to be presented at the BCPs will undergo documentary checks.
 Identity and physical checks will be carried out at a frequency depending on the risk

Import into Belgium: BCPs





- Provisions in the OCR:
 - Common Health Entry Document (CHED): prior notification + results checks + movement of consignments
 - IMSOC will allow the integration of all existing computerised systems (TRACES, RASFF, Europhyt, AAC)
 - close cooperation among Competent Authorities, customs authorities and other authorities involved



- Mandatory channeling of products to border control entities and uniform frequencies for checks apply to live animals, products of animal origin, plants and plant products
- vast majority of other products of relevance for the food chain is not channeled; exception: food and feed of non-animal origin which is temporarily subject to mandatory border controls due to the existence of an identified risk (i.e. the products listed under Implementing Regulation (EC) No 2019/1793.



- Import conditions laid down in delegated and implementing regulations
- Animals and products of animal origin: animal health import conditions laid down in Animal Health Law; in force as from 21 April 2021
- Exemption of certain animals and goods from official controls at Border Control posts



Import of animals and animal products

- The non-EU country of origin must be authorized; audits by DG SANTE – HFAA (formerly known as FVO)
- The establishment of origin must be approved and authorised to import into the EU (certain products of animal origin)
- The non-EU country of origin must have an approved residue plan
- veterinary certificate models



Import of animals and animal products

- Prior notification in TRACES NT and creation of Common Health Entry Document (CHED)
- Veterinary border control in Border control post (BCP)



Import of plants and plant products

- Plant health import conditions in Plant Health Law and delegated and implementing acts
- Certain plants, plant products and other objects entering the EU must have a phytosanitary certificate, issued by the exporting country's national plant protection authority
- Documentary, identity and physical check (Inspection to ensure the consignment is free from harmful organisms) – reduced checks possible
- Wood Packing Material (WPM) ISPM 15
- Europhyt: European database for the notification of interceptions for plant health reasons. Integrated in IMSOC



Import into Belgium

- Implementation of EU legislation
- FASFC = competent authority; close collaboration with Customs (protocol)
- Risk based annual control plan (inspections, samples)
- Instructions for BCP personnel published on FASFC intranet



Import into Belgium: some numbers - general

- Animals: 4,085 (0.2%)
- Animal products for human consumption: 22,968 (0.7%)
- Plants and plant products: 19,525 (1,0%)
- Animal products not for human consumption:
 2,539 (1,6%)

Imported consignments in 2018 (% rejected)




Import into Belgium: Indonesia - border rejections

- Aflatoxins in nutmeg (REG 2019/1793)
- Heavy metals in fishery products
- Presence of quarantine organisms
- Absence of certificate (or incomplete)




Import into Belgium: interceptions/border rejections
